The Fit is equipped with a number of features that can be set or adjusted to your customer's preferences. Set or adjust the items for your customer as listed below. Additional details on these features can be found in the Owner's Manual and Quick Start Guide. NOTE: default factory settings will appear in bold print.

1	<p>Radio Presets Each preset button (1-6) can store one frequency on AM, and two on FM. (FM1 and FM2)</p> <p>To store a station:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Use the tune, seek, or scan function to tune the radio to a desired station. Pick a preset number button (1-6). Hold it until you hear a beep. <p>AM _____</p> <p>FM1 _____ FM2 _____</p> <p>When an RDS radio station is selected, the station frequency and name are displayed otherwise only the frequency is displayed.</p> <p>Fit Sport and Fit Sport Navi have USB Audio Connectivity standard. Fit Base has an available USB accessory</p>	
2	<p>NAVIGATION SYSTEM</p> <p>Set address for "go home" voice recognition command, and GO HOME function in the navigation system.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Push the Set Up button and say or select More in the Navigation system. Say or select PERSONAL INFORMATION. Say or select HOME. Select Edit NAME/ADDRESS and enter the customer's home address. Demonstrate the "Go Home" function. Show the customer how to correctly use the navigation buttons and voice commands. Show the customer the location of the microphone on the ceiling (speak in normal voice). Show the customer the <i>Commonly Used Voice Commands</i> in the Quick Start Guide. 	
3	<p>Adjusting the front seats</p> <p>The front seat can be moved forward or backward by using the bar under the seat cushion's front edge. It can also be adjusted forward and backward using the lever on the outside of the seat bottom. Pull out the lever and push it forward. After moving the seat, always verify that it is locked in position. You can recline the seat-backs on the front seats so they are level with the rear seat cushions, making a large cushioned area. Remove the head rests and using the slide bar move the front seat cushions as far forward as possible. Pull up the seat-back angle adjustment lever and pivot the seat-back backward until it is level with the rear seat cushion.</p>	
4	<p>Adjusting the rear seats</p> <p>The Left and right rear seat cushions can be lifted up separately to make room for cargo. Pull up the rear seat cushion, and fold the seat leg down. Push the seat cushion firmly against the seat back to lock it.</p>	
ITEMS of Special Interest		
5	<p>TPMS -- Tire Pressure Monitoring System</p> <p>The FIT is equipped with TPMS. The Low Tire Pressure Indicator normally comes on for a few seconds when you turn the ignition to the ON (II) position. If it comes on while driving, it indicates that one or more of your vehicle's tires are extremely low on pressure.</p> <p>The TPMS indicator normally comes on for a few seconds when you turn the ignition to the ON (II) position. If it comes on and stays on at any other time there is a problem with the TPMS and the customer should contact the dealer.</p>	
6	<p>Windshield wipers/washers</p> <p>Push the wiper control lever up or down to select a position for front wiper operation. Pull the wiper control lever toward you and hold it. The washers spray until you release the lever. The wipers run at low speed and will complete one more sweep after you release the lever.</p> <p>Rotate the switch on the end of the wiper stalk towards you to operate the rear wiper. Rotate it in the opposite direction to operate the rear window washer.</p> <p>Note: When you shift the transmission to the reverse position with the front windshield wiper activated, the rear wiper operates automatically even if the rear wiper switch is off</p>	
7	<p>Heating & Air Conditioning (A/C)</p> <p>Customers appreciate a full demonstration of the front and climate control operation features.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Demonstrate how to operate the Heating System while using front controls. Demonstrate how to operate the Air Conditioning System while using front controls. Show where the Heating & A/C System operation instructions are located in the Quick Start Guide. 	
8	<p>Materials Scuffed and Soiled</p> <p>(a) Perform a last visual inspection of the vehicle with the customer and ensure that all interior damage is resolved</p> <p>(b) You can find instructions on how to care for your vehicle's interior on the Ownerlink Website. After logging in, search for "Car Care"</p>	
9	<p>FUEL ECONOMY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The values on the Monroney label are based on (model year) EPA mileage estimates, reflecting new EPA fuel economy methods beginning with 2008 models. Use for comparison purposes only. Do not compare to models before 2008. Your actual mileage will vary depending on how you drive and maintain your vehicle.
